You might consider--perhaps as supplementary reading--my book The Polarized Mind: Why It's Killing Us and What We Can Do About It (more info at: <u>https://amzn.to/2L7RQVU</u>). While this work presents an existential-phenomenological slant on culture (power centers) throughout history, and only provides brief synopses, it still may be of interest because of its relevance to the current state of our society and world. The polarized mind is the fixation on a single point of view to the utter exclusion of competing points of view, which I see it as the psychosocial "scourge" of humanity, while also providing possible alternatives to address this global/historical challenge.
