Objectives of the Workshop

This two-day workshop is an invitation to co-learners to have a first-hand experience of: understanding the nature of 'qualitative data'

- Developing insights about the aim and scope of various scientific paradigms and methods,
- Building research relationship that has the potential to provide a humanizing space to the participants,
- Generating contextually 'rich' qualitative data,
- Analyzing qualitative data (coding and memo writing), and
- Establishing scientific rigour of the findings.

Context and Rationale

Exclusion and marginalization of various sections of human society, through macro socio-political features and events such as colonization, poverty, patriarchy have been the basis of the need for utilizing qualitative methodology within social sciences since 1960s. Various critical perspectives including decolonization approach, postcolonial theory, critical theory paradigm, social constructionism and postmodernism have not only pointed to the denial of voice of these sections living primarily in the non-Western world (that form the majority of human population), but have accentuated the need to recover and center the silenced or unheard human voices. The Indian knowledge and cultural traditions are a rich treasure house of concepts, theories and principles, that need to be voiced.

Reflection on the history of qualitative psychology/social science makes us realize the immense potential qualitative methodology has to reconstruct everyday life experiences of people within their relational, cultural and socio-political contexts towards a future society based on fellowship. In this workshop, there will be a specific focus of the rich textual, folk and cultural resources available in Health, educations and well-being, that can be voiced through the use of qualitative methodologies.

Recently, he has contributed a chapter in the forthcoming 2019 edition of the Sage Handbook of Grounded Theory edited by Anthony Bryant and Kathy Charmaz.
