## Tenure-Track Faculty Position in Psychology: Clinical Psychology

The Department of Psychology at the College of the Holy Cross invites applications for a full-time tenure-track appointment to begin in August 2017 in the area of clinical psychology. The successful candidate will teach *Abnormal Psychology*, intermediate and advanced courses in his or her specialty area, and service courses such as *Introduction to Psychology*, *Statistics*, or *Research Methods*. Faculty members in the Department of Psychology are expected to maintain an active program of independent research, to engage students in the research process, and to demonstrate a commitment to and excellence in undergraduate teaching and mentoring in the context of liberal arts education.

A Ph.D. is required before the start of employment. This position carries a 3-2 teaching load with a full-salary one-semester research leave prior to tenure review and generous sabbatical and fellowship leaves for tenured faculty. Tenure track appointments offer competitive salaries and include full benefits. Tenure track faculty are also eligible to receive substantial travel support and reimbursement of relocation costs within the College's published policies.

Please submit a cover letter addressing the position requirements listed above along with a curriculum vitae, a statement of research interests, representative reprints (no more than three), a statement of teaching interests and philosophy, graduate and undergraduate transcripts, and three confidential letters of recommendation, at least one of which speaks explicitly to teaching experience. As a Jesuit, undergraduate liberal arts college, Holy Cross is committed to the flourishing of a richly diverse academic community. In your letter and/or supporting materials, therefore, please address how your scholarship, teaching, mentoring, and/or service might support the College's mission (see <a href="http://www.holycross.edu/diversity">http://www.holycross.edu/diversity</a>).
