Abstract Guidelines:

- 1.Abstracts must be submitted in English.
- 2.Abstracts should not exceed 500 words excluding the title, author(s)'s name(s) and keyword(s).
- 3.The topic of the abstract has to be highly relevant to the Seven Topic Areas listed above or on the website.
- Both empirical papers (either quantitative or qualitative) and theoretical papers are welcome.
- 5.If your abstract is accepted, you will be invited to give a 10-minutes oral presentation, followed by 5 minutes of Q&A.
- 6.If you are willing to publish your full paper, the organizing committee will facilitate the publication of papers in partner journals.
